One may pay a non-member fee to USEF to show in these classes, however, it is often less expensive to join the USEF ▪ If the owner is not a USDF GMO member or a USDF Participating member, they must apply for and receive a USDF Non Member ID number in order to show in USDF DSHB shows. Scoring	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Median scores (like USDF), but IBC scores and Series Finals classes DO NOT count – only scores from open, age and sex-specific classes will count. Horses must have shown in at least three shows to have a median score 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Highest points in each national division; all zones combined to determine the winner for those divisions that have zone points only, horse with highest number of points in all zones compared is the winner

To be eligible for awards, the owner of the horse must be a current AHS member as of September 30, and the horse must be properly transferred and/or recorded in their name.

Scoring	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Median Score must be 60%+ for USEF levels and 58%+ for FEI levels to qualify ▪ Training thru Fourth Levels: minimum of eight scores with two scores 58%+ from highest test of level ▪ FEI levels: minimum of four scores with median of 58% to qualify ▪ Freestyles: minimum of three scores plus two non-freestyle scores at that level of 58%+ ▪ USDF tracks these scores for the AHS. You must follow their eligibility rules.
